



Student create on an iPad via the mobile site or the Padlet App.
*Students can post on a Padlet by scanning the QR code you provide

Padlet is like having your own virtual corkboard (virtual wall).

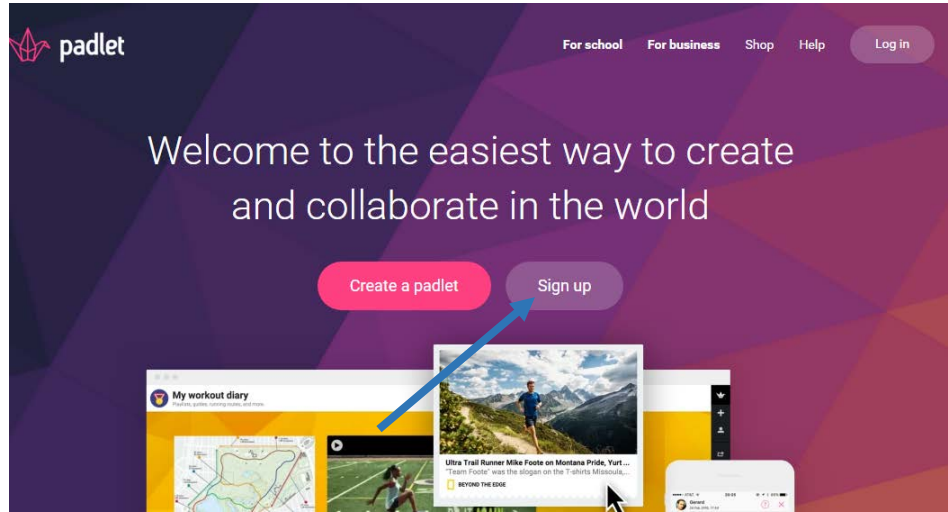
Place items all over the corkboard (wall) and share it with students or create a blank Padlet with a starter topic or question for students to add to.

A free Padlet account allows you to create as many Padlet "walls" as you would like.

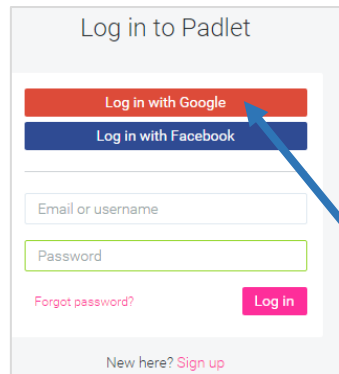
Once you have created a wall, students can post virtual sticky notes all over the wall. The sticky notes can contain text, a link, a document, an image, audio, or a video.

Padlet walls can be shared through email, posting a url link, embedding, and QR codes. Privacy can be set many different ways.

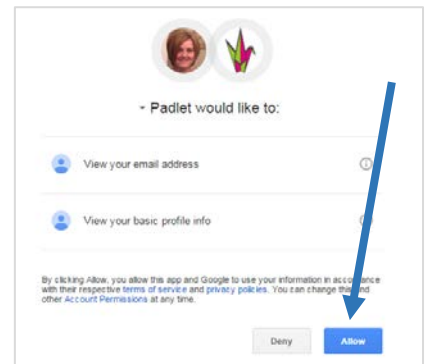
1. Go to <https://padlet.com>
2. Click "Sign Up"



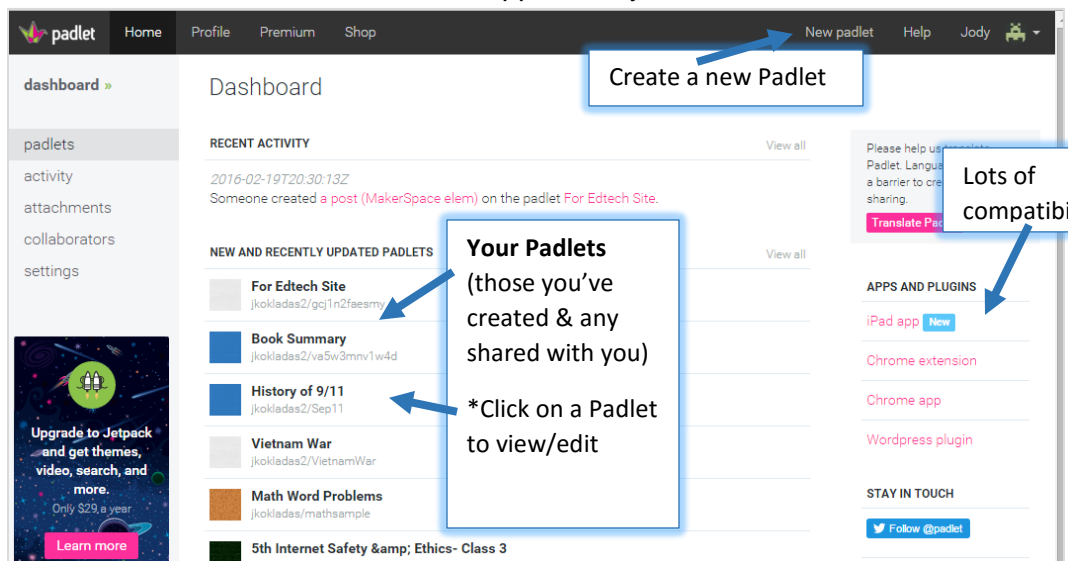
3. Click "Log in with Google"




4. Click "Allow"

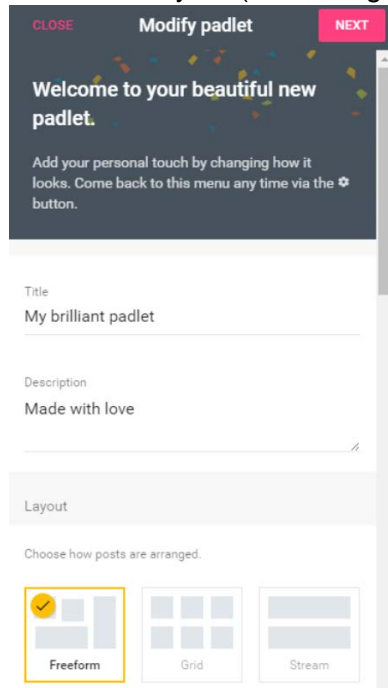


The main screen that appears is your Dashboard

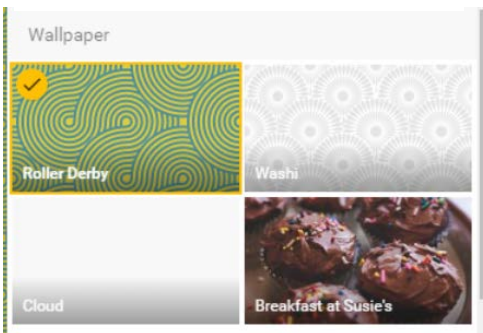


Creating a Padlet...

1. Log in to the Padlet website <https://padlet.com>
2. Click 
3. Give the Padlet a title
optional: add a description (this is a great place for directions)
4. Choose a Layout (freeform/grid/stream)



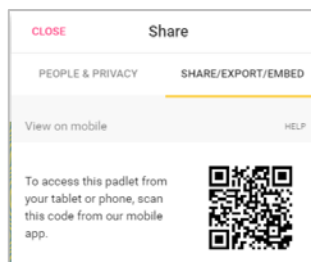
5. Choose a wallpaper



 Other Settings:

- ***Posts:** show author name in posts (if your Padlet users are logging in)
- ***Address:** Customize your Padlet's URL

6. Click next to set the sharing settings
(or click  once you're ready)



PEOPLE & PRIVACY

- *set privacy (easiest to use with kids is "secret" or "public")
- *set what those with access can do (read/write/moderate/administer)

SHARE/EXPORT/EMBED

- *get QR code
- *copy Padlet link
- *embed
- *email
- *export an image or pdf or the Padlet
- *print the Padlet

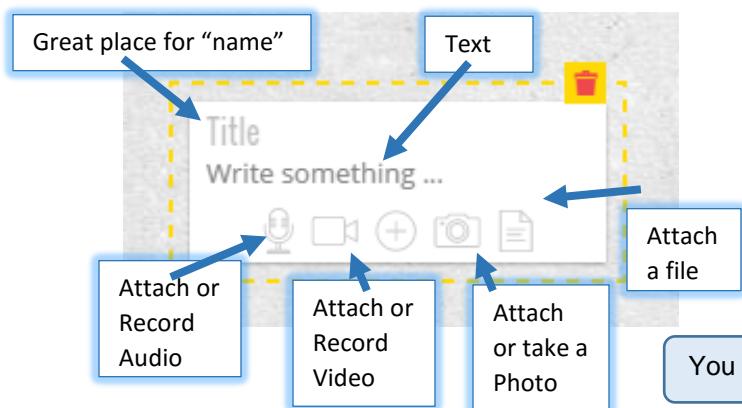

Adding a post...

Double click on the Padlet Wall

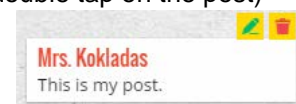
- *Add a title & text
- *Attach links, files images, videos



Click and drag a post to move it

Editing a post...

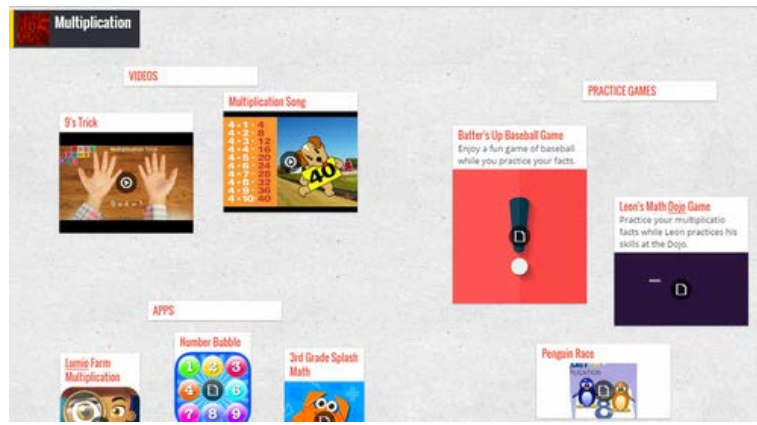
Hover over the post & click the pencil icon (on an iPad double tap on the post)



- *Students can only edit the posts they create.
- *Moderators (creator of the Padlet & those added as moderators) can edit any posts.

You can also drag & drop files to the Padlet to create a post.

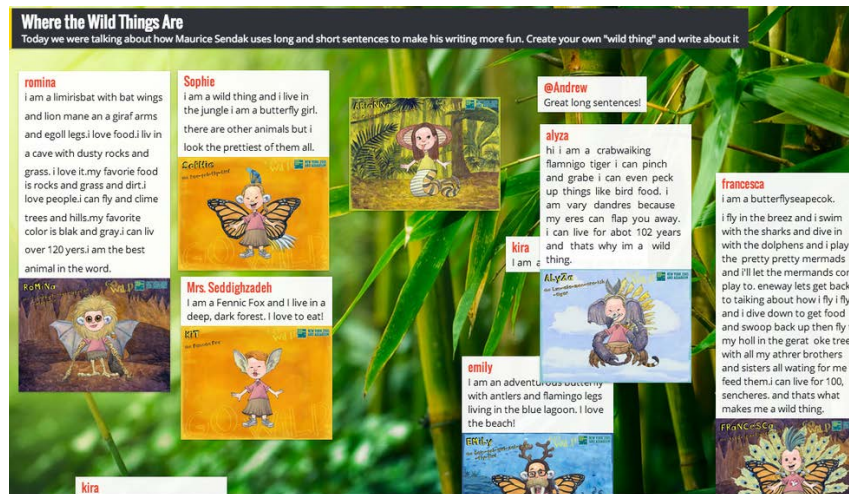
