# CANVAS TIPS & TOOLS

As faculty and students share their experiences with Canvas thus far, the one common thread amongst much of the feedback is consistency. We are building consistency within one instructional platform and that consistency is huge.

>Canvas Guidelines from Sept

- ⇒ Looking for a better understanding of the student side of Canvas or need a way to test a canvas integration? You can add one of the test users below to any of your courses.
  - 1. In your navigation, click on People > click '+ People'
  - 2. Type in the email for the user you want to add (ex: SSTest@shadysideacademy.org)

Once the user is a student in your course, you can log in as that user to experience your course as a student would.

- ⇒ Accidently delete a page/assignment/quiz. You can retrieve it!
  - 1. Navigate to your home page
  - Add /undelete at the end of the course URLa list will appear with everything that has been deleted.
  - 3. Find the item you want & click 'restore'



- ⇒ One more tip to make grading and feedback easier: Teach your students how to scan a PDF when they are sending you an assignment, instead of sending you multiple pictures. If they have an iPad or iPhone this can easily be done in the NOTES app or in the FILES App. Ms. Brunner created a great student resource video highlighting this. Another helpful tool for scanning a document as a PDF is Genius Scan app (Android, IOS)

## **APPS & EXTENSIONS TO CHECK OUT**

<u>Keynote (IOS & Mac)</u> - Keynote is Apple's version of PowerPoint/Slides. It has a TON of built in creation tools like drawing, object animation, and sound recording within any slide.

<u>Loom</u> - My favorite tool for screen recording. Recordings are saved to the cloud so you just share a link. I suggest downloading the <u>full desktop app</u>.

<u>Flipgrid</u> - Still one of the best for collaborative conversation and video feedback. Updates for this year include screen recording, annotation, and voice only recording.

<u>Blooket</u> - Fun games to review content. May seem too 'young' for SS but who knows they may enjoy it too. The students love the glitches they can earn to use on other students screens. (Thx for sharing Ms. Greif)

<u>Toby</u> (Chrome) – A great way to organize your tab & bookmark insanity

<u>PearDeck</u> (Google Slides or PowerPoint Add-On) - Add formative assessment directly into any slide deck

<u>Poll Everywhere</u> (Google Slides/Keynote/PowerPoint Add-On) - Incorporate interactive questions directly into your slide decks

**Google Forms Quizzes** - Self scoring quizzes

Padlet - Digital Post-It Boards

GoSoapBox - Web-based clicker tool

#### **Seesaw Tips & Updates**

Seesaw now has the ability to add voice to any shape, image, or label.

- \* Add layering to any activity
- \* Create scaffolding within any lesson


# SSA Spotlight
